## **RESOLUTION NO. 2022-11-05**

## A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF JEFFCO BUSINESS CENTER METROPOLITAN DISTRICT NO. 1 CALLING A REGULAR ELECTION FOR DIRECTORS MAY 2, 2023

A. The terms of the office of Director John Strabel shall expire upon the election of his successor at the regular election, to be held on May 2, 2023 ("**Election**"), and upon such successor taking office.

B. Vacancies currently exist on the Board of Directors of the District.

C. In accordance with the provisions of the Special District Act ("Act") and the Uniform Election Code ("Code"), the Election must be conducted to elect three (3) Directors to serve until the second regular election, to occur May 4, 2027.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Jeffco Business Center Metropolitan District No. 1 (the "**District**") of the City and County of Broomfield, Colorado:

1. <u>Date and Time of Election</u>. The Election shall be held on May 2, 2023, between the hours of 7:00 A.M. and 7:00 P.M. pursuant to and in accordance with the Act, Code, and other applicable laws. At that time, three (3) Directors shall be elected to serve until the second regular election, to occur May 4, 2027.

2. <u>Precinct</u>. The District shall consist of one (1) election precinct for the convenience of the eligible electors of the District.

3. <u>Conduct of Election</u>. The Election shall be conducted as an independent mail ballot election in accordance with all relevant provisions of the Code. The Designated Election Official shall have on file, no later than fifty-five (55) days prior to the Election, a plan for conducting the independent mail ballot Election.

4. <u>Designated Election Official</u>. James Ruthven shall be the Designated Election Official and is hereby authorized and directed to proceed with any action necessary or appropriate to effectuate the provisions of this Resolution and of the Act, Code or other applicable laws. The Election shall be conducted in accordance with the Act, Code and other applicable laws. Among other matters, the Designated Election Official shall appoint election judges as necessary, arrange for the required notices of election (either by mail or publication) and printing of ballots, and direct that all other appropriate actions be accomplished.

5. <u>Call for Nominations</u>. The Designated Election Official shall provide Call for Nominations as required under Section 1-13.5-501, C.R.S., as applicable.

6. <u>Absentee Ballot Applications</u>. NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN, pursuant to Section 1-13.5-1002, C.R.S., that applications for and return of absentee ballots may be filed

with the Designated Election Official of the District, c/o Special District Management Services, Inc., 141 Union Boulevard, Suite 150, Lakewood, Colorado 80228, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., until the close of business on the Tuesday immediately preceding the Election (April 25, 2023).

7. <u>Self-Nomination and Acceptance Forms</u>. Self-Nomination and Acceptance Forms are available and can be obtained from the Designated Election Official for the District, at the above address.

8. <u>Cancellation of Election</u>. If the only matter before the electors is the election of Directors of the District and if, at 5:00 P.M. on February 28, 2023, the sixty-third day prior to the regular election, there are not more candidates than offices to be filled at the Election, including candidates timely filing affidavits of intent, the Designated Election Official shall cancel the Election and declare the candidates elected. Notice of such cancellation shall be published and posted in accordance with law.

9. <u>Severability</u>. If any part or provision of this Resolution is adjudged to be unenforceable or invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remaining provisions of this Resolution, it being the Board of Director's intention that the various provisions hereof are severable.

10. <u>Repealer</u>. All acts, orders and resolutions, or parts thereof, of the Board of Directors which are inconsistent or in conflict with this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent only of such inconsistency or conflict.

11. <u>Effective Date</u>. The provisions of this Resolution shall take effect as of the date adopted and approved by the Board of Directors of the District.

## RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE JEFFCO BUSINESS CENTER METROPOLITAN DISTRICT NO. 1 ESTABLISHING REGULAR MEETING DATES, TIME, AND LOCATION, AND DESIGNATING LOCATION FOR POSTING OF 24-HOUR NOTICES

A. Pursuant to Section 32-1-903(1.5), C.R.S., special districts are required to designate a schedule for regular meetings, indicating the dates, time and location of said meetings.

B. Pursuant to Section 32-1-903(5), C.R.S., "location" means the physical, telephonic, electronic, or virtual place, or a combination of such means where a meeting can be attended. "Meeting" has the same meaning as set forth in Section 24-6-402(1)(b), C.R.S., and means any kind of gathering, convened to discuss public business, in person, by telephone, electronically, or by other means of communication.

C. Pursuant to Section 24-6-402(2)(c)(I), C.R.S., special districts are required to designate annually at the board of directors of the district's first regular meeting of each calendar year, the public place at which notice of the date, time and location of regular and special meetings ("**Notice of Meeting**") will be physically posted at least 24 hours prior to each meeting ("**Designated Public Place**"). A special district is deemed to have given full and timely notice of a regular or special meeting if it posts its Notice of Meeting at the Designated Public Place at least 24 hours prior to the meeting.

D. Pursuant to Section 24-6-402(2)(c)(III), C.R.S., special districts are relieved of the requirement to post the Notice of Meeting at the Designated Public Place, and are deemed to have given full and timely notice of a public meeting if a special district posts the Notice of Meeting online on a public website of the special district ("**District Website**") at least 24 hours prior to each regular and special meeting.

E. Pursuant to Section 24-6-402(2)(c)(III), C.R.S., if a special district is unable to post a Notice of Meeting on the District Website at least 24 hours prior to the meeting due to exigent or emergency circumstances, then it must physically post the Notice of Meeting at the Designated Public Place at least 24 hours prior to the meeting.

F. Pursuant to Section 32-1-903(1.5), C.R.S., all meetings of the board that are held solely at physical locations must be held at physical locations that are within the boundaries of the district or that are within the boundaries of any county in which the district is located, in whole or in part, or in any county so long as the physical location does not exceed twenty (20) miles from the district boundaries unless such provision is waived.

G. The provisions of Section 32-1-903(1.5), C.R.S., may be waived if: (1) the proposed change of the physical location of a meeting of the board appears on the agenda of a

meeting; and (2) a resolution is adopted by the board stating the reason for which meetings of the board are to be held in a physical location other than under Section 32-1-903(1.5), C.R.S., and further stating the date, time and physical location of such meeting.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Jeffco Business Center Metropolitan District No. 1 (the "**District**"), Broomfield County, Colorado:

1. That the provisions of Section 32-1-903(1.5), C.R.S., be waived pursuant to the adoption of this Resolution.

2. That the Board of Directors (the "**District Board**") has determined that conducting meetings at a physical location pursuant to Section 32-1-903(1.5), C.R.S., would be inconvenient and costly for the directors and consultants of the District in that they live and/or work outside of the twenty (20) mile radius requirement.

3. That regular meetings of the District Board for the year 2024 shall be held on November 6, 2024 at 9:00 a.m., to be held via video and telephone conference.

4. That special meetings of the District Board shall be held as often as the needs of the District require, upon notice to each director.

5. That, until circumstances change, and a future resolution of the District Board so designates, the physical location and/or method or procedure for attending meetings of the District Board virtually (including the conference number or link) shall appear on the agenda(s) of said meetings.

6. That the residents and taxpaying electors of the District shall be given an opportunity to object to the meeting(s) physical location(s), and any such objections shall be considered by the District Board in setting future meetings.

7. That the District has established the following District Website, <u>https://jeffcobusinesscentermd1.colorado.gov</u>, and the Notice of Meeting of the District Board shall be posted on the District Website at least 24 hours prior to meetings pursuant to Section 24-6-402(2)(c)(III), C.R.S. and Section 32-1-903(2), C.R.S.

8. That, if the District is unable to post the Notice of Meeting on the District Website at least 24 hours prior to each meeting due to exigent or emergency circumstances, the Notice of Meeting shall be posted within the boundaries of the District at least 24 hours prior to each meeting, pursuant to Section 24-6-402(2)(c)(I) and (III), C.R.S., at the following Designated Public Place:

That for the purposes of meeting all general fund expenses of the District during the 2024 budget year, the District determined to levy mills upon each dollar of the total valuation for assessment of all taxable property within the District, as set forth in the budget, to raise the required revenue.

2. That for the purposes of meeting all debt service fund expenses of the District during the 2024 budget year, the District determined to levy mills upon each dollar of the total valuation for assessment of all taxable property within the District, as set forth in the budget, to raise the required revenue.

3. That the Accountant of the District is hereby authorized and directed to immediately certify to the County Commissioners of the City and County of Broomfield, Colorado, the mill levies for the District as set forth in the District's Certification of Tax Levies (attached hereto as **EXHIBIT A** and incorporated herein by reference), recalculated as needed upon receipt of the final certification of valuation from the County Assessor in order to comply with any applicable revenue and other budgetary limits.

## RESOLUTION NO. 2023-11-\_\_\_\_ JEFFCO BUSINESS CENTER METROPOLITAN DISTRICT NO. 1 AMENDING POLICY ON COLORADO OPEN RECORDS ACT REQUESTS

A. On November 6, 2013, Jeffco Business Center Metropolitan District No. 1 (the "**District**") adopted Resolution No. 2013-11-05 Regarding Colorado Open Records Act Requests, as amended by certain Resolution No. 2014-11-05 First Amendment to Resolution No. 2013-11-05 Regarding Colorado Open Records Act Requests, and subsequently amended on June 9 2021 (the "**Resolution**"), in which the District adopted a policy related to Colorado Open Records Act Requests (the "**Policy**").

B. In 2023, the Colorado General Assembly enacted Senate Bill 23-286, which provided for certain changes in the law related to Colorado Open Records Act Requests

C. The District desires to amend the Policy due to the legislative changes set forth in Senate Bill 23-286.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of Jeffco Business Center Metropolitan District No. 1, Broomfield County, Colorado:

1. <u>Defined Terms</u>. Capitalized terms used but not otherwise defined herein shall have the meaning ascribed to them in the Resolution.

2. <u>Amendments to Policy</u>. The Policy is hereby amended as follows:

(a) <u>Amendment to Section 3 of the Resolution</u>. Section 3 of the Resolution is hereby deleted in its entirety, and substituted in lieu thereof shall be the following:

"3. Within the period specified in Section 24-72-203(3)(a), C.R.S., as amended from time to time, the Official Custodian shall notify the record requester that a copy of the record is available, but will only be sent to the requester once the custodian either receives payment or makes arrangements for receiving payment for all costs associated with records transmission and for all other fees lawfully allowed, unless recovery of all or any portion of such costs or fees has been waived by the Official Custodian, or where prohibited or limited by law. Upon either receiving such payment or making arrangements to receive such payment at a later date, the Official Custodian shall provide the record(s) to the requester as soon as practicable, but no more than three (3) business days after receipt of, or making arrangements to receive, such payment."

(b) <u>Amendment to Section 5 of the Resolution</u>. Section 5 of the Resolution is hereby deleted in its entirety, and substituted in lieu thereof shall be the following:

"5. The Official Custodian shall not charge a per-page fee for providing records in a digital or electronic format."

(c) <u>Amendment to Section 7 of the Resolution</u>. Section 7 of the Resolution is hereby deleted in its entirety, and substituted in lieu thereof shall be the following:

"7. All requests for copies or inspection of public records of the District shall be submitted to the Official Custodian in writing. Such requests shall be delivered by the Official Custodian to the District's legal counsel for review and legal advice regarding the lawful availability of records requested and related matters, including without limitation, whether to deny inspection or production of certain records or information for reasons set forth in Sections 24-72-204(2) and (3), C.R.S., as amended from time to time. The District may, from time to time, designate specific records for which written requests are not required and with respect to which review by legal counsel is not required; i.e., service plans, rules and regulations, minutes, etc. Such designations shall occur in the minutes of the meetings of the District."

3. Except as expressly set forth herein, the Resolution continues to be effective without modification.
