DISCLOSURE OF POTENTIAL CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

Following discussion, upon motion duly made by Director von Clausburg, seconded by Director Strabel, and upon vote unanimously carried, the Board acknowledged the District's inability to make a scheduled bond payment, and directed Attorney Williams to respond to the correspondence from Colorado BondShares.

<u>2023 Budget Amendment Hearing</u>: The President opened the public hearing to consider the Resolution to Amend the 2023 Budget and discuss related issues.

It was noted that publication of a Notice stating that the Board would consider adoption of a Resolution to Amend the 2023 Budget and the date, time and place of the public hearing was made in a newspaper having general circulation within the District. No written objections were received prior to the public hearing.

No public comments were received and the President closed the public hearing.

Following discussion, upon motion duly made by Director von Clausburg, seconded by Director Strabel, and upon vote unanimously carried, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2023-11-02 to Amend the 2023 Budget.

<u>2024 Budget Hearing</u>: The President opened the public hearing to consider the proposed 2024 Budget and discuss related issues.

It was noted that publication of Notice stating that the Board would consider adoption of the 2024 Budget and the date, time and place of the public hearing was made in a newspaper having general circulation within the District. No written objections were received prior to or at this public hearing.

No public comments were received, and the President closed the public hearing.

Mr. Solin reviewed the estimated year-end 2023 revenues and expenditures and the proposed 2024 estimated revenues and expenditures.

Upon motion duly made by Director von Clausburg, seconded by Director Strabel, and upon vote unanimously carried, the Board approved the 2024

Budget, as discussed, and considered adoption of Resolution No. 2023-11-03 to Adopt the 2024 Budget and Appropriate Sums of Money and Resolution No. 2023-11-04 to Set Mill Levies (6.000 mills in the General Fund and 29.000 mills in the Debt Service Fund, for a total mill levy of 35.000 mills.) Following discussion, upon vote unanimously carried, the Board adopted the Resolutions and authorized execution of the Certification of Budget. Mr. Solin was directed to transmit the Certification of Tax Levies to the Board of County Commissioners of Broomfield County subject to receipt of final assessed valuation. Mr. Solin was directed to transmit the Certification of Budget to the Division of Local Government no later than January 31, 2024.

DLG-70 Certification of Tax Levies Form ("Certification"): Following discussion, upon motion duly made by Director von Clausburg, seconded by Director Strabel, and upon vote unanimously carried, the Board authorized the District Accountant to prepare and sign the Certification, and directed the District Accountant to file the Certification with the Board of County Commissioners and other interested parties.

<u>2025 Budget Preparation</u>: Following discussion, upon motion duly made by Director von Clausburg, seconded by Director Strabel, and upon vote unanimously carried, the Board appointed the District Accountant to prepare the 2025 Budget. The Board determined to hold the public hearing to consider adoption of the 2025 Budget on November 14, 2024, at 9:00 a.m., via Zoom video/teleconference.

Payment of 2023 Debt Service Obligation: Mr. Solin and Attorney Williams discussed with the Board the status of funds received from Special District Management Services, Inc., and payment of 2023 Debt Service obligation. The Board noted that all funds have been deposited into the District's account.

RESOLUTION NO. 2024-11-01

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE JEFFCO BUSINESS CENTER METROPOLITAN DISTRICT NO. 1 ESTABLISHING REGULAR MEETING DATES, TIME, AND LOCATION, ESTABLISHING DISTRICT WEBSITE AND DESIGNATING LOCATION FOR POSTING OF 24-HOUR NOTICES

A. Pursuant to Section 32-1-903(1.5), C.R.S., special districts are required to designate a schedule for regular meetings, indicating the dates, time and location of said meetings.

B. Pursuant to Section 32-1-903(5), C.R.S., "location" means the physical, telephonic, electronic, or virtual place, or a combination of such means where a meeting can be attended. "Meeting" has the same meaning as set forth in Section 24-6-402(1)(b), C.R.S., and means any kind of gathering, convened to discuss public business, in person, by telephone, electronically, or by other means of communication.

C. Pursuant to Section 24-6-402(2)(c)(I), C.R.S., special districts are required to designate annually at the board of directors of the district's first regular meeting of each calendar year, the public place at which notice of the date, time and location of regular and special meetings ("**Notice of Meeting**") will be physically posted at least 24-hours prior to each meeting ("**Designated Public Place**"). A special district is deemed to have given full and timely notice of a regular or special meeting if it posts its Notice of Meeting at the Designated Public Place at least 24-hours prior to the meeting.

D. Pursuant to Section 24-6-402(2)(c)(III), C.R.S., special districts are relieved of the requirement to post the Notice of Meeting at the Designated Public Place, and are deemed to have given full and timely notice of a public meeting, if a special district posts the Notice of Meeting online at a public website of the special district ("**District Website**") at least 24-hours prior to each regular and special meeting.

E. Pursuant to Section 24-6-402(2)(c)(III), C.R.S., if a special district is unable to post a Notice of Meeting on the District Website at least 24-hours prior to the meeting due to exigent or emergency circumstances, then it must physically post the Notice of Meeting at the Designated Public Place at least 24-hours prior to the meeting.

F. Pursuant to Section 32-1-903(1.5), C.R.S., all meetings of the board that are held solely at physical locations must be held at physical locations that are within the boundaries of the district or that are within the boundaries of any county in which the district is located, in whole or in part, or in any county so long as the physical location does not exceed twenty (20) miles from the district boundaries unless such provision is waived.

G. The provisions of Section 32-1-903(1.5), C.R.S., may be waived if: (1) the proposed change of the physical location of a meeting of the board appears on the agenda of a meeting; and (2) a resolution is adopted by the board stating the reason for which meetings of the board are to be held in a physical location other than under Section 32-1-903(1.5), C.R.S., and further stating the date, time and physical location of such meeting.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Jeffco Business Center Metropolitan District No. 1 (the "**District**"), City and County of Broomfield County, Colorado:

1. That the provisions of Section 32-1-903(1.5), C.R.S., be waived pursuant to the adoption of this Resolution.

2. That the Board of Directors (the "**District Board**") has determined that conducting meetings at a physical location pursuant to Section 32-1-903(1.5), C.R.S., would be inconvenient and costly for the directors and consultants of the District in that they live and/or work outside of the twenty (20) mile radius requirement.

3. That regular meetings of the District Board for the year 2025 shall be held on June _____ and November ____, 2025 at 9:00 A.M., virtually via teleconferencing.

4. That special meetings of the District Board shall be held as often as the needs of the District require, upon notice to each director.

5. That, until circumstances change, and a future resolution of the District Board so designates, the physical location and/or method or procedure for attending meetings of the District Board virtually (including the conference number or link) shall appear on the agenda(s) of said meetings.

6. That the residents and taxpaying electors of the District shall be given an opportunity to object to the meeting(s) physical location(s), and any such objections shall be considered by the District Board in setting future meetings.

7. That the District Board authorizes establishment of a District Website, if such District Website does not already exist, in order to provide full and timely notice of meetings of the District Board online pursuant to the provisions of Section 24-6-402(2)(c)(III), C.R.S.

8. That, if the District has established a District Website, the Notice of Meeting of the District Board shall be posted on the District Website at least 24-hours prior to each meeting pursuant to Section 24-6-402(2)(c)(III), C.R.S. and Section 32-1-903(2), C.R.S.

9. That, if the District has not yet established a District Website or is unable to post the Notice of Meeting on the District Website at least 24-hours prior to each meeting due to exigent or emergency circumstances, the Notice of Meeting shall be posted within the boundaries of the District at least 24-hours prior to each meeting, pursuant to Section 24-6-402(2)(c)(I) and (III), C.R.S., at the following Designated Public Place:

(a) On the monument sign at the north entrance on 116th Circle and Wadsworth Blvd.

10. Special District Management Services, Inc., or his/her designee, is hereby appointed to post the above-referenced notices.

WHEREAS, it is not only required by law, but also necessary to appropriate the revenues provided in the budget to and for the purposes described below, as more fully set forth in the budget, including any inter-fund transfers listed therein, so as not to impair the operations of the District.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Jeffco Business Center Metropolitan District No. 1:

1. That the budget as submitted, amended, and summarized by fund, hereby is approved and adopted as the budget of the Jeffco Business Center Metropolitan District No. 1 for the 2025 fiscal year.

That for the purposes of meeting all debt service fund expenses of the District during the 2025 budget year, the District determined to levy mills upon each dollar of the total valuation for assessment of all taxable property within the District, as set forth in the budget, to raise the required revenue.

That the Accountant of the District is hereby authorized and directed to immediately certify to the County Commissioners of the City and County of Broomfield, Colorado, the mill levies for the District as set forth in the District's Certification of Tax Levies (attached hereto as **EXHIBIT A** and incorporated herein by reference), recalculated as needed upon receipt of the final certification of valuation from the County Assessor in order to comply with any applicable revenue and other budgetary limits.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF JEFFCO BUSINESS CENTER METROPOLITAN DISTRICT NO. 1 CALLING A REGULAR ELECTION FOR DIRECTORS MAY 6, 2025

A. The terms of the offices of Directors Lamer and Von Clausberg shall expire upon the election of their successors at the regular election, to be held on May 6, 2025 ("**Election**"), and upon such successors taking office.

B. Two (2) vacancies currently exist on the Board of Directors of the District.

C. In accordance with the provisions of the Special District Act ("Act") and the Uniform Election Code ("Code"), the Election must be conducted to elect two (2) Directors to serve until the next regular election, to occur May 4, 2027, and two (2) Directors to serve until the second regular election, to occur May 8, 2029.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Jeffco Business Center Metropolitan District No. 1 (the "**District**") of the City and County of Broomfield, Colorado:

1. <u>Date and Time of Election</u>. The Election shall be held on May 6, 2025, between the hours of 7:00 A.M. and 7:00 P.M. pursuant to and in accordance with the Act, Code, and other applicable laws. At that time, two (2) Directors shall be elected to serve until the next regular election, to occur May 4, 2027, and two (2) Directors shall be elected to serve until the second regular election, to occur May 8, 2029.

2. <u>Precinct</u>. The District shall consist of one (1) election precinct for the convenience of the eligible electors of the District.

3. <u>Conduct of Election</u>. The Election shall be conducted as an independent mail ballot election in accordance with all relevant provisions of the Code. The Designated Election Official shall have on file, no later than fifty-five (55) days prior to the Election, a plan for conducting the independent mail ballot Election.

4. <u>Designated Election Official</u>. David Solin shall be the Designated Election Official and is hereby authorized and directed to proceed with any action necessary or appropriate to effectuate the provisions of this Resolution and of the Act, Code or other applicable laws. The Election shall be conducted in accordance with the Act, Code and other applicable laws. Among other matters, the Designated Election Official shall appoint election judges as necessary, arrange for the required notices of election (either by mail or publication) and printing of ballots, and direct that all other appropriate actions be accomplished.

5. <u>Call for Nominations</u>. The Designated Election Official shall provide Call for Nominations as required under Section 1-13.5-501, C.R.S., as applicable.

6. <u>Absentee Ballot Applications</u>. NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN, pursuant to Section 1-13.5-1002, C.R.S., that applications for and return of absentee ballots may be filed with David Solin, the Designated Election Official of the District, c/o McGeady Becher Cortese Williams P.C., 450 E. 17th Avenue, Suite 400, Denver, Colorado 80203, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., until the close of business on the Tuesday immediately preceding the Election (April 29, 2025).

7. <u>Self-Nomination and Acceptance Forms</u>. Self-Nomination and Acceptance Forms are available and can be obtained from David Solin, the Designated Election Official for the District, c/o c/o Special District Management Services, Inc., 141 Union Boulevard, Suite 150, Lakewood, Colorado 80228, and on the District's website at https://jeffcobusinesscentermd1.colorado.gov/.

8. <u>Cancellation of Election</u>. If the only matter before the electors is the election of Directors of the District and if, at 5:00 P.M. on March 4, 2025, the sixty-third day prior to the regular election, there are not more candidates than offices to be filled at the Election, including candidates timely filing affidavits of intent, the Designated Election Official shall cancel the Election and declare the candidates elected. Notice of such cancellation shall be published and posted in accordance with law.

9. <u>Severability</u>. If any part or provision of this Resolution is adjudged to be unenforceable or invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remaining provisions of this Resolution, it being the Board of Director's intention that the various provisions hereof are severable.

10. <u>Repealer</u>. All acts, orders and resolutions, or parts thereof, of the Board of Directors which are inconsistent or in conflict with this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent only of such inconsistency or conflict.

11. <u>Effective Date</u>. The provisions of this Resolution shall take effect as of the date adopted and approved by the Board of Directors of the District.
